Tenterden, the Jewel of the Weald, is a charismatic and historic town in the heart of the Kent countryside. Part of the Borough of Ashford, it is well connected to Ashford and Maidstone by the A262 and the A28 and to Tunbridge Wells via National Route 18 of the National Cycle Network.

Tenterden is rich in history, with the distinctive St Mildred's Church a prominent sight from the High Street. Tenterden High Street is full of historic buildings, independent shops, delicious eateries and coffee shops.

Over 800 years ago Tenterden had access to the sea with a port at Smallhythe. The coastline has changed considerably since then and the sea is now over 10 miles away. As a result of its history Tenterden is a member of the Cinque Ports Confederation and the town's coat of arms includes the Cinque Ports.

Tenterden is a lively town with lots of annual events throughout the year including the Tenterden Folk Festival, the Spirit of Tenterden Festival and Tributes in the Park.

Popular attractions include the Kent & East Sussex Railway which takes you on a nostalgic trip through some of the finest Kent countryside all the way to Bodiam Castle. Tenterden also boasts the award winning Chapel Down Winery which is England's leading wine producer.



CYCLE ROUTES

WEALDEN CYCLE TRAIL

This 42 miles (67km) route is the best way to enjoy Kent's quintessential Garden of England, complete with apple orchards, oast houses and picture postcard villages. The route runs along small country lanes through the High Weald, a designated Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). Not recommended for novice riders, the ride forms part of the well-signposted Sustrans National Route 18.

ASHFORD TO TENTERDEN CYCLE ROUTE

This 11.8 miles (19km) route forms part of the well signposted National Route 18, as above. This ride will take in many of the main sights Tenterden has to show. As you cycle from Ashford to Tenterden, places of interest include Victoria Park, Ashford Community Woodland, Biddenden Vineyard and Kent & East Sussex Railway.

WALKING ROUTES

HIGH WEALD LANDSCAPE TRAIL

This linear 90 mile route takes you through the High Weald and right through Tenterden town centre. Much of the landscape on this trail has been known to inspire many artists, poets and writers such as William Morris, Siegfried Sassoon and Henry James.

KENT & EAST SUSSEX RAILWAY WALK – TENTERDEN STATION

This 6 mile (9.7m) circular walk leaves from Tenterden station and takes you across Tenterden and beyond taking in the local countryside. Enjoy refreshments at the Tenterden Station refreshment rooms and the many public houses and cafés in Tenterden.

Chapel Down

Chapel Down are England's leading winemaker with a mission to change the way the world thinks about English wine. Experiences range from guided tours and tutored wine tastings to lunch in the restaurant and overnight stays.



Smallhythe Place

Steeped in history, this National Trust property is an early 16th century house and cottage gardens, once home to Ellen Terry a popular Victorian actress.

Tenterden & District Museum

Kent & East Sussex Railway

Enjoy this popular heritage railway based in Tenterden and travel through the beautiful Rother Valley as it makes its way to Bodiam.


