

# Destination Tenterden Tenterden

Relax and unwind as you discover Tenterden, an archetypal Kentish town known to many as the 'Jewel of the Weald'.

The impressive tree-lined High Street and lanes running off it are simply bursting with independent shops selling antiques, gifts and crafts. You'll find a vibrant mix of quirky cafes, pubs and restaurants, plus interesting architecture; cute cottages, a medieval church and Tudor and Georgian buildings. There's everything you need for a memorable short break.

And as you travel beyond Tenterden you can stop off at the picture postcard villages of Biddenden, Rolvenden, Smarden, Woodchurch and Appledore.







Tenterden is twinned with Avallon in the Burgundy region of France – another top area for wine and vineyards.

The town was once an important trading port, but is no longer linked to the sea. It has been a Cinque Port since 1449.

#### Tentertainment

Tenterden's own version of Glastonbury, this free music festival takes place each July. The hugely popular family event has an impressive line-up of performers and bands to suit all ages and tastes.














Located on the delightfully named Gribble Bridge Lane for over 50 years, Biddenden is well known for its award-winning estate grown wines and famous Strong Kentish ciders Twenty-three acres of south facing slopes provide perfect grape growing conditions, giving the wines real character and flavour.

Head to the shop for the full range of wines, ciders and juices as well as other local goodies. Try Gribble Bridge Meats too for a tasty selection of hand reared, grass fed beef. Stroll round the vineyard or pre-book a guided tour.

Enjoy the mix of old and new – from the old cider press to the fully automated bottling line.

#### Chapel Down Winery

This impressive winery is the country's leading English wine producer. Its award-winning sparkling wines are rumoured to have been served at the Royal Wedding in 2011.

Pick up a map in the shop and enjoy a free self-guided tour of its breathtaking vineyards or book a full guided tour and marvel at the winery's grape press (largest in the UK) and high tech kit in the modern winery. You'll also find out about Chapel Down's own beer and cider.

Have a drink in the herb garden, an inviting sun trap filled with fragrance.

#### Gusbourne Estate (Visits by appointment only)

This vineyard and wine maker is one to watch; while the original estate dates back to the 13th century, its current owner is creating very modern English sparkling wines that have already received accolades from wine industry experts. Nothing but perfection will do for this exciting wine producer on Tenterden's outskirts.

You can find the wines on the menus of some of the country's finest restaurants and they are widely available to buy, or visit the vineyard itself by appointment.

Pretty rose bushes among the vines are an early warning of disease. White and red roses hint at which colour grape you'll find!

The stunning 400 acre Hush Heath Estate, home to the Balfour-Lynn family, boasts vast ancient oak woodlands, vineyards, orchards and meadows, which you can explore at your leisure.

The estate is immaculately kept; its 40 acres of vines flourish in Hush Heath's own warm micro-climate which helps to create vibrant, fruity wines.

Guided tours are available, but must be pre-booked. Or simply turn up for a tasting anything goes here and you'll receive a warm welcome whatever your wine knowledge

#### Hole Park

#### feeling hungry?

You'll probably work up an appetite as you tour our vineyards and breweries, so make sure you leave time for eating.

Tenterden is lucky enough to have three Michelin starred restaurants within easy reach, The West House at Biddenden, The Curlew at Bodiam and Apicius in Cranbrook. If that doesn't tickle your tastebuds, alternatives include the stylish yet comfortable restaurant at Chapel Down or many gastropubs in the surrounding villages. Back to Tenterden itself, you'll find restaurants and cafes galore for a light lunch, quick coffee or afternoon tea.

#### Re-charge your batteries

Whether you're looking for a home from home, a luxurious retreat or a bargain place to rest your head; Tenterden and the area surrounding it have plenty of accommodation to choose from.

If glamping is your thing, you'll find yurts, safari tents and hoppers' huts, or there's plenty of good old English B&Bs in tranquil rural settings. Alternatively, there are beautiful hotels with spa baths and four poster beds if that's more to your taste.

A journey to Tenterden is hassle free, and just 38 minutes from central London to nearby Ashford by train.

Travel from London St Pancras to
Ashford International on the high speed train. Taxis are available at Ashford station for the 20 minute journey to Tenterden and there's also a regular bus service.

If you're travelling by car, Tenterden is situated on the A28 between Hastings and Ashford and is less than an hour by car from the M25.
